Vocabulary

- **Tumors** – abnormal growth/mass of tissue that results when cells divide more than they should
- **Metastasize** – to spread or grow
- **Benign** – not cancerous/won't spread
- **Malignant** – are cancerous/can spread

Stages

- These describe the severity of the cancer
- Helps determine treatment
- Helps determine prognosis

Stages

Stages 1-3

Higher numbers=more extensive the illness

Stage 4

Cancer has spread to other organs

**Earlier detection = better prognosis
